## Moorside Project; Stage 2 Development Consent Order Consultation

### SECTION 47 PLANNING ACT 2008

Notice as to where and when the Stage 2 Statement of Community Consultation for the Moorside Project can be inspected

NuGeneration Limited (NuGen) is proposing to develop the Moorside Project which includes the construction and operation of a new generation nuclear power station of up to 3.8 GW gross capacity. This figure is subject to turbine and technology choices which NuGen is currently considering and as a result, the actual generating capacity for the turbine and technology that is ultimately selected may be 5% higher or lower than this figure.

The proposed Moorside Power Station is a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP), as defined by the Planning Act 2008 and therefore requires a Development Consent Order (DCO) from the Secretary of State for Energy and Climate Change.

NuGen is proposing to carry out works to create new stretches of railway, stations and platforms on additional sites at and between Corkickle and Mirehouse, new track at St Bees

and at least one rail spur into the Moorside site with associated stations, platforms, sidings and rail freight facilities. These railway works may also qualify as an NSIP, subject to their final design. Similarly, NuGen is proposing to carry out works for a Marine Off-Loading Facility (MOLF) which may also qualify as an NSIP, subject to its final design.

Additionally, NuGen is proposing to seek consent for development associated with the Moorside Power Station ("Associated Development"). This will include works at the Moorside site, worker accommodation sites at Corkickle, Egremont and Mirehouse, and highways improvement works on a further nine additional sites within Cumbria. If the railway works and the MOLF described above are ultimately not definable as NSIP, they may be included in the proposed DCO as Associated Development. Highway, bridge, rail and

storage buildings and facilities works are also proposed at the Port of Workington unless final logistics assessments prove they are not necessary to support the project.

The entirety of these works comprise the "Moorside Project", and the sites are collectively referred to as the "Moorside Project sites".

NuGen is required to carry out an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) of the proposed Moorside Project under the Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2009 (as amended). The EIA will consider the potential impacts, both positive and negative, of the Moorside Project, including cumulative impacts.

NuGen has published a Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) in accordance with Section 47 of the Planning

Act 2008. The SoCC sets out how NuGen proposes to consult people living in the vicinity of the Moorside Project sites on its proposals. The SoCC sets out how NuGen will carry out statutory consultation between 14th May and 30th July 2016 (inclusive) with people living in the vicinity of the Moorside Project sites.

The proposals which are to be consulted on include the development of the Moorside Power Station, the railway works, the MOLF, the Associated Development and environmental mitigation measures at the Moorside Project sites.
