

<p><i>Consulting you on our proposals</i></p>	<p>Whole Section: The following is an alternative first section: “The Moorside Site, which is adjacent to the Sellafield site in West Cumbria, has been identified by the Government in a national policy statement as potentially suitable for a new nuclear generating station. As a nationally Significant Infrastructure Project, NuGen will need to make an application to the Secretary of State for Energy and Climate Change for a Development Consent Order (DCO).</p> <p>The Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC) sets out the process of how NuGen is going to consult on the proposed Moorside Nuclear Generating Station, with people living in the vicinity of the site of the generating station itself, and sites for any additional supporting development. The SoCC is intended to help you understand how we will be consulting with you and how, at each consultation stage, you will be able to express your views on our proposals. Before a DCO application is made, NuGen is required to consult with those living in the vicinity of the site, Local Authorities, persons with an interest in the land and prescribed statutory bodies. This SoCC describes our plans for consulting those living within the vicinity of the site. The SoCC is not a consultation document and this is not part of NuGen consultation, which will be taking place in 2 stages; Stage 1- Strategic Issues Consultation starting in May 2015 and Stage 2- Proposed Application Consultation starting in approximately 2016 - prior to an application being submitted around spring 2017. We have consulted with the relevant Local Authorities on the content of this SoCC and have taken their views into account. The relevant Local Authorities are:</p> <p>Copeland Borough Council (CBC) - the Moorside Site is located in CBC’s area, in addition, Associated Development may also take place within its area;</p> <p>Allerdale Borough Council (ABC) - Associated Development may also take place within ABC’s area;</p> <p>Cumbria County Council (CCC) - the Moorside Site and any Associated Development would be located within CCC’s area.”</p>	<p>ABC Formal letter</p>	<p>The first section has been reviewed and amendments made to provide clearer language.</p>


